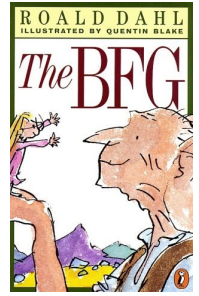

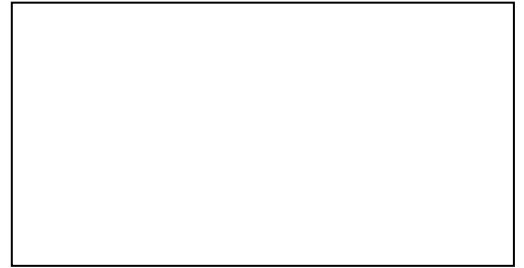

Sophie stared hard across the misty moonlit street. The giant (if that was what he was) was wearing a long BLACK CLOAK.

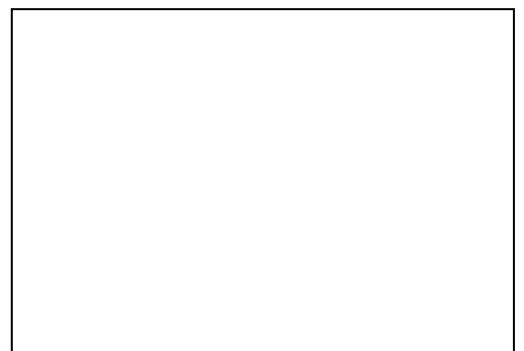
In one hand he was holding what looked like a VERY LONG, THIN TRUMPET.


